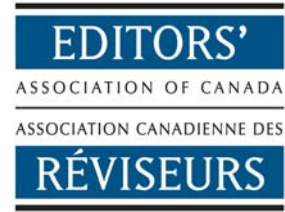

EAC's 2011 Certification Tests

Registration for the 2011 certification tests opens in July 2011. The Copy Editing and Stylistic Editing tests will be written on Saturday, November 19, 2011 in Vancouver, Edmonton, Calgary, Saskatoon, Winnipeg, Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal and Halifax. The Proofreading and Structural Editing tests will be offered in 2012.
